





My research portfolio has built a cohesive story over time:
From MAMAS (stigma & ANC/HIV access) →

- → ANC-HIV & FP-HIV integration → ECHO
- → iCCM (community systems) → MOTIVATE & MACCESS (digital innovation)
- → Pith Moromo & Pii Enigma (structural determinants)
- → Covid era: Vaccine clinical trials (Covid, RSV, HPV)
- → Tunawiri, TATUA, VSM (mental health & social support).

Each grant builds on the previous:

→moving from qualitative and epidemiologic studies → implementation science → biological mechanisms, and → large clinical and vaccine trials

creating a coherent path toward stronger health systems.

A deliberate grantdevelopment pathway (Co-I → Co-PI → independent PI)

enabled mentees to secure their own funding and transition into scientific leadership.



Navigate Shifts: The "Repackaging" Mindset

Case Study 1: The Pivot

- Core Skill: Leading complex women's health trials.
- Repackaged From: Contraceptive safety (ECHO Trial).
- Repackaged To: Vaccine efficacy (KEN SHE HPV Trial).

Case Study 2: The Deep Dive

- Identified Gap: Mental health was the missing piece in AGYW wellbeing.
- Strategic Move: Returned to medical school for Psychiatry.
- Result: New expertise, new funding streams (Tunawiri, TATUA studies).

From Principal Investigator to Institutional Leader



Amplifying Scientific Impact

Moving from Principal Investigator to institutional leader enables broader scientific influence through interdisciplinary collaboration and larger-scale initiatives.

Administrative roles offer valuable insights into policy-making, resource allocation, and the functioning of institutional systems, empowering informed decision-making.

Systems Thinking: Leadership in Action: The One-Stop-Shop

Established KEMRI's One-Stop-Shop External Grants Office

Unlocked nearly Ksh 7 billion in annual grants portfolio by streamlining KEMRI's grant management processes.

Served as KEMRI's Lead Interface with Key Stakeholders

Collaborated closely with the Ministry of Health, National Treasury, Attorney General's Office, and development partners to navigate complex policy and regulatory environments.

Played a Pivotal Role in High-Stakes Negotiations

Led negotiations with partners like Wellcome Trust, USARMY-WRAIR, LSTM, CDC, and JICA, balancing institutional integrity and national interests.

Coordinated KEMRI's Diverse Scientific Programs

Provided strategic oversight and operational operational leadership for KEMRI's seven multidisciplinary research programs, spanning a spanning a staff complement of ~2,000.

Contribution 1: Evidence for Community Health



- Provided critical evidence on the role of community community health workers (CHWs) in strengthening community health systems in Kenya.

 Kenya.
- We have demonstrated that CHWs can safely and safely and effectively deliver essential services like services like treating childhood pneumonia, malaria, and diarrhea in the community, as well as well as providing family planning and mental health health support.
- This evidence has informed national policies and policies and guidelines, enabling the scale-up of up of these community-based interventions to interventions to achieve universal health coverage.

Contribution 2: Innovation for Access



Mobile phone improving adherence

A mobile-based platform to improve adherence and retention among women integrated community case management living with HIV in Kenya



Community health workers with smartphones

Use of mobile phones to enhance (iCCM) delivery in Homa Bay County, Kenya



Data management system

Expertise in the design, implementation, and evaluation of digital health interventions and electronic data management systems

Impact: Demonstrated how tech can solve practical barriers to care

Contribution 3: Centering Mental Health

Identified Mental Health as a Critical Gap

Recognized that mental health was a missing piece in the holistic wellbeing of adolescents and young women (AGYW) in sub-Saharan Africa.

Building a New Sub-Specialty

Combining expertise in infectious diseases, maternal health, and psychiatry to pioneer an integrated approach at the intersection of HIV, sexual and reproductive health, and mental health.

Leading Landmark Mental Health Integration Studies

Now serving as the Principal Investigator on two groundbreaking studies - Tunawiri and TATUA - that aim to integrate mental health care into existing HIV and perinatal services.

Mentoring the Next Generation

Supervising graduate students whose research explores the links between mental health, HIV, and other global health challenges, building capacity in this critical area.



Contribution 4: Understanding the Political Landscape

- Used political science frameworks to analyze adolescent health prioritization
- Applied Public Arenas Model to understand policy gaps
- Examined competing definitions of adolescent pregnancy in Kenya

Impact: Research doesn't just identify health problems - it analyzes the system to find solutions
